

Orientation for New Third Term Exchange Students

An orientation session was held in October, 2012 to welcome new exchange students on the university's program (hereafter referred to as the 'Japan-China-Korea Program') adopted by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology as part of its Program for Advanced Professional Training through Japan-China-Korea Interuniversity Exchanges.

This orientation aimed to help exchange students who had just arrived in Japan smoothly transition into student life at the university by explaining classes that students will take for the next two years and helping them to create all the documents required after admission.

A total of 11 exchange students, 1 from Korea and 10 from China, were admitted as third term students on the Japan-China-Korea Program. Added to the 17 exchange students admitted in October last year and April this year (13 from China and 4 from Korea), this gives a total of 28 exchange students.

First of all there was a speech from the Program representative, Akio Okayasu, Dean of the Graduate School of Marine Science and Technology, welcoming the new students and outlining his hopes for their futures and the new students listened attentively. Mr Tsuchiya, Graduate School Officer of the Academic Affairs Division explained about university administration such as taking classes and points to note about receiving scholarships. Associate Professor, Yayoi Oshima, explained the contents of supplementary Japanese language classes as well as checking current exchange student Japanese language levels through one-to-one conversations. Finally, Mr Tsuchiya and 3 coordinators helped the 11 new students to complete all the required documents in Japanese.
