A cruising seminar was held for graduate students who are studying abroad at TUMSAT over the two-day period from November 6, 2013 via the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology's Advanced Professional Training Project Through Exchange Between Universities in Japan, China, Korea, etc.
